Recipients of the 2013 National Dairy Quality Awards (NDQA) were announced during the National Mastitis Council (NMC) 53rd Annual Meeting, January 26 - 28, 2014, in Fort Worth, Texas.

Now in its 20th year, the NDQA program's goal is to honor dairy producers from across the United States who have successfully placed top priority on producing milk of the highest quality. NMC, Hoard's Dairyman, Merial, GEA Farm Technologies, Ecolab Inc., IBA Inc., and Select Sires sponsored the awards.

Dairy farms are nominated for the award by professionals in the dairy industry who work with producers, such as dairy plant field representatives, veterinarians, DHI supervisors and Extension personnel. Over 200 dairy farms were nominated in 2013.

Finalists from this year's program were judged by milk quality experts who looked at quality indicators, such as somatic cell count, bacteria count and incidence of mastitis. Applications were also evaluated for milking routine, systems of monitoring udder health, protocols for detecting and treating clinical and subclinical cases of mastitis, record keeping, strategies for overall herd health and welfare, and adherence to drug use regulations.

Platinum, Gold and Silver winners were designated from the group of finalists.

RKB Dairy is owned by Randy and Kathy Bauer and family of Faribault, Minnesota The 96-cow Holstein and Jersey dairy averaged a 35,222 somatic cell count in the application year. Kathy and son, Glen, take the lead in managing milk quality and Kathy is in the parlor for every milking. The family milks in a double-9 parabone parlor, where they routinely change inflations and vigorously maintain milking equipment. To prevent mastitis, they vaccinate cattle, focus on putting clean milkers on clean cows and watch teat end condition closely. "The Bauer family makes milk quality the number one priority on their dairy. Through exceptionally high standards, attention to detail and, most importantly, follow through day in and day out, they put the best product possible in the bulk tank every day," noted nominator Brandon Balzer with IBA.



As repeat winners, **Beattie Farms**, Holton, Michigan, maintains milk quality success while producing 24,776 pounds of milk per cow, with an average somatic cell count of 77,677. Don Beattie, owner, is pictured with herdsperson Jennifer Saxton, who is the farm's milk quality lead. The farm has a double-16, rapid-exit, herringbone parlor. The cows are housed in a sand-bedded freestall barn, with dry cows in a 50- by 80-foot pack barn with access to a dirt lot. Sand is added to stalls weekly. Their nominator, Lyndsay Earl, with Michigan Milk Producers Association, stated, "Beattie Farms does a great job of managing their farm to ensure safe, quality milk leaves the farm every day. They are able to maintain excellent quality by paying close attention to animal health and properly maintaining their milking equipment."



A 75,000 SCC put **Dick Haven Farms LCC** in the 2013 National Dairy Quality Awards winners' circle. The 220-cow Holstein dairy owned by Gordon Dick, McBain, Michigan, averaged a 1,000 SPC across the nomination year. Cows are milked in a double-6 herringbone and milking equipment is maintained twice a year. A two-row, sand-bedded freestall is used for housing and stalls are dusted once a month with hydrated lime. "Dick Haven Farms is a very progressive operation. They strive to achieve good udder health and quality by engaging in management practices that focus on the needs of the cows versus the convenience of the management team and employees," added Michigan Milk Producers Association nominator Deb Navarre.



Owned by Duane and Janet Molhoek, **End Road Dairy**'s 151 Holsteins averaged 28,217 pounds of milk and 70,000 SCC in the application year. The dairy milks in a double-4 herringbone and they work with their milk equipment dealer so parlor maintenance is done on a life expectancy basis. Before treated cows are returned to the bulk tank, they must come back negative on a Delvo test. In the freestall barn, alleys are scraped three times a day and sand is added every 10 to 14 days. Molhoeks were also nominated by Deb Navarre, who said, "End Road Dairy is very particular with their management practices. They maintain good habits while working on the farm and around the cows, and they expect their employees to practice and maintain good habits, as well."



From the Empire State, Melissa Murray and Sean Quinn's **Easton Dairy**averaged 71,000 SCC over the application year. The 90 Holsteins,
Jerseys, Brown Swiss and Guernseys that call the Greenwich, New York dairy home are milked in a double-5 herringbone. At Easton Dairy, rubber inflations are changed every two months, milk hoses every six months, pulsator hoses every year, and they check the parlor according to National Mastitis Council recommendations every six months. Nominator Ruth McCuin, with Agri-Mark, noted, "Sean and Melissa are committed every day to do whatever it takes to achieve a lower SCC. Attention to detail no matter how big or small is what makes this dairy work. Record keeping is a priority. Their goal is to improve all the time and keep making high-quality milk."



The fourth Michigan herd named a 2013 Platinum winner is **Tubergen Dairy Farm, LLC**, Ionia, Michigan The 700-cow operation is owned by Dennis, Doris, Kurt and Todd Tubergen. Milkers wear gloves at all times and change gloves three times during each shift. Cows are milked in a double-12 herringbone milking parlor, using triangle Impulse vented liners to reduce teat end pressure. The Tubergens cultured half of their clinical mastitis cases last year and used the results to determine appropriate treatments. Nathan Lippert, nominator from Dairy Farmers of America, said that, "Tubergen Dairy Farm is a farm that continues to excel in all aspects of the dairy industry. They are always looking for ways to make their farm more efficient and strive to produce the highest quality milk possible."
